

Elisabeth Stark holds a chair of Romance linguistics at Zurich (UZH). Her core interests are the comparative morphosyntax of Romance nominals and micro-variation in French (register variation), both in a synchronic and diachronic perspective and integrating variationist and formal approaches to language. She has published in journals such as *Linguistic variation*, *Journal of Semantics*, *Linguistics* and *Probus*; she is member of the scientific boards of *Zeitschrift für Sprachwissenschaft*, *Lingvisticae Investigationes* and *Langages* and of the book series *Linguistische Arbeiten* at Mouton de Gruyter and *Orbus Romanicus* at Narr, and acts as academic referee for various institutions and publishers. Since 2011, she has been the director of two big interdisciplinary research projects (grants from the Swiss National Science Foundation) on multilingual variation in WhatsApp messages and text messages; in 2018-2021, she will co-direct an international project (SNSF, DFG) on partitive articles in minor Romance languages. She is director of the *Zurich Center for Linguistics*, director of one research group (on nominal determination) inside the Zurich research priority program “*Language and Space*” and director of the Doctoral Graduate Program in Linguistics at UZH. She was elected as a member of Academia.net in 2012.
